

Kindergarten Mutch Home Learning Week 10

Choose 1-2 from Math and 1-2 from Literacy each day: (It's ok to do the same one on more than one day.)

(The links should work when you click on them, please copy and paste if they don't)

Math

This week, students can practice counting backwards from 20-0. This may be difficult, if so, focus on the other math activities below. I've expanded the number line below to help with counting. (We only need to count to 10 in kindergarten, so if your child has reached that goal, that's perfect! ☺)

This is Curious George game gets students to "estimate" or guess before counting. Have fun playing "Bug Catcher":

Lighter and heavier: This week's scavenger hunt is about "mass" and uses the terms "lighter" and "heavier". It is attached in a picture below the learning mat.

Connect the dots: I would recommend that students start with 0-10, then try 11-20, and maybe further. It's fun to see what picture they create!

Literacy

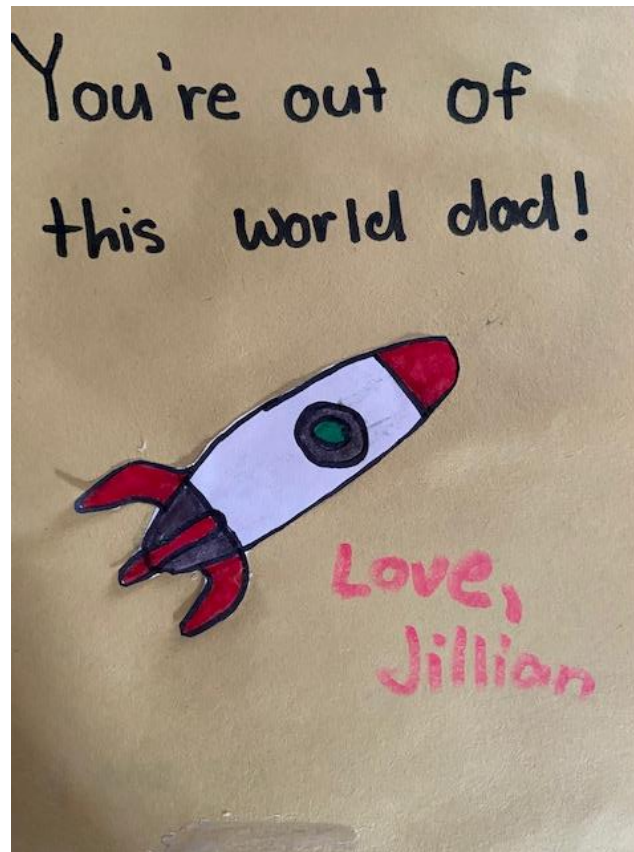
This week we are introducing the words *see, are & not*. There is an attachment to help practice these sight words.
