
## Kindergarten Writing:

This week I am finishing my book. Below are the instructions from last week, in case you didn't have time to start your book yet. Or, maybe you're starting a new book this week. This is any easy activity to get students to write and illustrate, and it is a nice break from our usual Writing Workshop paper. I encourage students to continue writing over the summer. Not necessarily every day, but making a book is a nice keepsake for summer memories. (Plus it reviews letter formation, spaces between words, etc. ©)

Cut or fold 1-2 pieces of paper in half, and staple together. (I used 2 pieces, and when I folded and stapled it, it turned into an 8 page book)

Write and illustrate your own story! I'd love to see it! My book is about ice cream, but I encourage students to write about anything that they would like to! Here is my book:
