Math

Say the following number sequences and ask your child to tell you which number you missed (Do it orally, don't let them see the numbers):

1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 7, 8, 9, 10 (missing 6)

10, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 3, 2, 1 (missing 4)

1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 10 (missing 9)

10, 9, 8, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1 (missing 7)

Show your child the following number sequences and ask them to find the mistakes:

1, 2, 3, 5, 4, 6, 7, 8,

7, 6, 5, 3, 4, 2

4, 5, 6, 7, 9, 8, 10

9, 7, 8, 6, 5, 4, 3

 Hit. Students could also read picture books, cartoons, recipes, magazines, audio books, etc. We've learned 3
 ways to read a book:
- 1. Read by talking about the pictures 2. Read the words. 3. Retell a book that someone has previously read to you.




