Literacy

 Tomorrow we will be finishing them and sharing! Remember when we write stories we have at least 4 sentences.
 - First sentence says what happened.
 - Next 2-3 sentences give some details about it
 - Last sentence is your ending your feelings (how you felt, what you hoped, thought, wished, etc). **Reminder to parents to encourage your child to get their writing done but do not sit right with them nor help them spell. They have all the skills they need. We do not want to make them reliant on an adult. They have been taught to "do your best and keep going"!

**Some children write more than others, if your child has already finished their story encourage them to begin another story. It's a good idea to write each day.

- Continue to practice counting forward and backwards between 1-20 as well as practicing reading number words to 10.
