Quatrain: 4 lines of poetry.

Formed by two rhyming couplets.

This pattern is called a a b b. The first line rhymes with the second, and the third line rhymes with the fourth line.

Other quatrain patterns are a b a b, a b b a, and a b c b.

Example (a a b b):

Out by the sea, there was a flea. He wanted to learn to swim, but ended up going to the gym.

Haiku:

Japanese form of poetry.
Form is 17 syllables in three lines with pattern: first line, 5 syllables; second line 7 syllables; third line, 5 syllables. Usually has nature themes.

Beach

Beach sand is like salt,

the air surrounding is fresh.

A place to recharge.

Limerick:

Lines 1, 2 and 5 rhyme. Lines 3 and 4 rhyme.

Usually humorous in nature.

Down at the bog there was a frog, who made friends with a dog. Everyday they would meet, and enjoy a sweet treat.

And read their favorite blog.

<u>Couplet</u> - two lines of poetry which are a self-contained unit.

There once was a young frog, who made friends with dog.

Concrete or Shape Poem

A concrete or shape poem is a poem that forms a picture of the topic, or follows the contours of a shape that is suggested by the topic. In other words a concrete poem is one that takes the shape of the object it describes.
